PHILADELPHIA NIGHTTIME **COMMUNITY SURVEY FACTS**



In 2019, 24HrPHL surveyed 365 patrons, artists, and industry professionals in Philadelphia's night-time creative economy to understand that community's dimensions, priorities, and values.

KEY FINDINGS

Issues ranked as "moderate" or "serious" problems

- 1. Closing times
- 2. Preservation of DIY spaces
- 3. Sexual harassment or assault
- 4. Wages for industry professionals
- 5. Cost of liquor licenses

Values ranked as most important for nightlife

- 1. Inclusivity
- 2. Safety
- 3. Creativity
- Sexual and gender minorities and women expressed greater levels of concern for intolerance, harassment, safety of DIY spaces.
- **Venue owners / managers** have much stronger concerns about costs of liquor licenses, tax rates and nuisances. 96% support licensing reform.

- **53%** of Artists/Musicians considered **moving**.
- 86.7% support closing hours extended beyond 2AM.
- 61% of all survey participants support night time economy post or office.
